Our small class sizes and close relationships between faculty and students allow teachers to identify individual learning styles, abilities, and interests.



PREPARING CHILDREN FOR A LIFETIME OF INTELLECTUAL EXPLORATION, PERSONAL AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH, AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

In Scofield Christian School's Early Childhood Pre-school program (age three - Transitional Kindergarten), students are engaged in a God-centered learning environment focused on play to develop an understanding of the world around them. Here, the joy of discovery and sense of achievement are celebrated.

Our teachers inspire creativity and imagination. Our curriculum allows students to explore each topic using the gifts and talents God has given them and build the foundation for academic excellence. This rich and varied program works to enhance each child's wonder of learning while preparing them for tomorrow.

We create an optimal learning environment for children, with a focus on Biblical concepts, phonemic awareness, and learning math through conceptual play. The curriculum includes Art, Music, Spanish, Science, Library, PE, our Environmental Learning Center, and Discovery Days.



SETTING THE STAGE FOR GROWTH

From the earliest age, children lay the groundwork to become life-long learners. Our Lower Elementary (Kindergarten - 2) offers an academically appropriate program developed to build confident and caring learners. With small classes and a high degree of personal attention and differentiated learning, our students are introduced to a wide array of experiences at a young age, including a favorite - cursive handwriting.

In a Christ-centered environment, Scofield students are known and loved. Our teachers understand the intellectual, emotional, and spiritual needs of each Scofield student. Our research-based curriculum encourages students to develop confidence, independence, creativity, perseverance, and problem-solving abilities. Curiosity and discovery are encouraged in each classroom and co-curricular classes as well as in our Environmental Learning Center, on class field trips, and during Discovery Days. Spiritual education through weekly chapel services and our Honorable Character program promotes the virtues of honor, obedience, diligence, wisdom, kindness, self-control, orderliness, service, attentiveness, cooperation, initiative, honesty, forgiveness, and responsibility.
